### FOOD MARKETS

Food markets can be entirely outdoors, in **(1)** .....; or inside a covered market building. London, Paris, Vienna, Madrid, Rome, and other major cities have many of these food markets located in neighbourhoods throughout each city. Smaller towns might have only one **(8)** ....., whereas in a village there might be an open-air market only once a week, usually on Saturday.
