How to haggle

- Once you've expressed interest in an item, the price tag is generally 20% higher than what the **(1)** is actually willing to accept.
- If a piece is 200 euros, you can ask: "How much room do you have in that?"
- If he says, 150 euros, you can say, "I'll give you 130 euros **(2)**"
- You usually meet in the middle. You say, "what's your best **(3)** on this?" and he'll say, "what's yours?"
- Customers often start to walk away and are **(4)** back. If not, you may come back to the stand 15 minutes later. If the piece is still there, you can often renegotiate or settle on the **(5)** offer.
