

## WORKSHEET 4

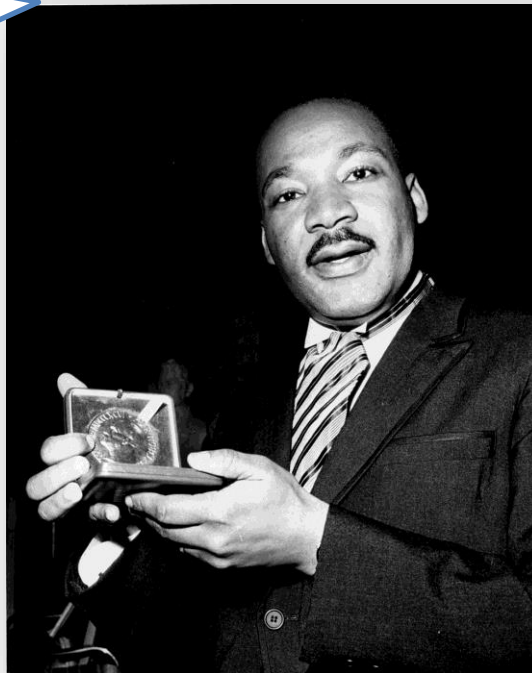

“I refuse to accept the view that mankind is so tragically bound to the starless midnight of racism and war that the bright daybreak of peace and brotherhood can never become a reality.”

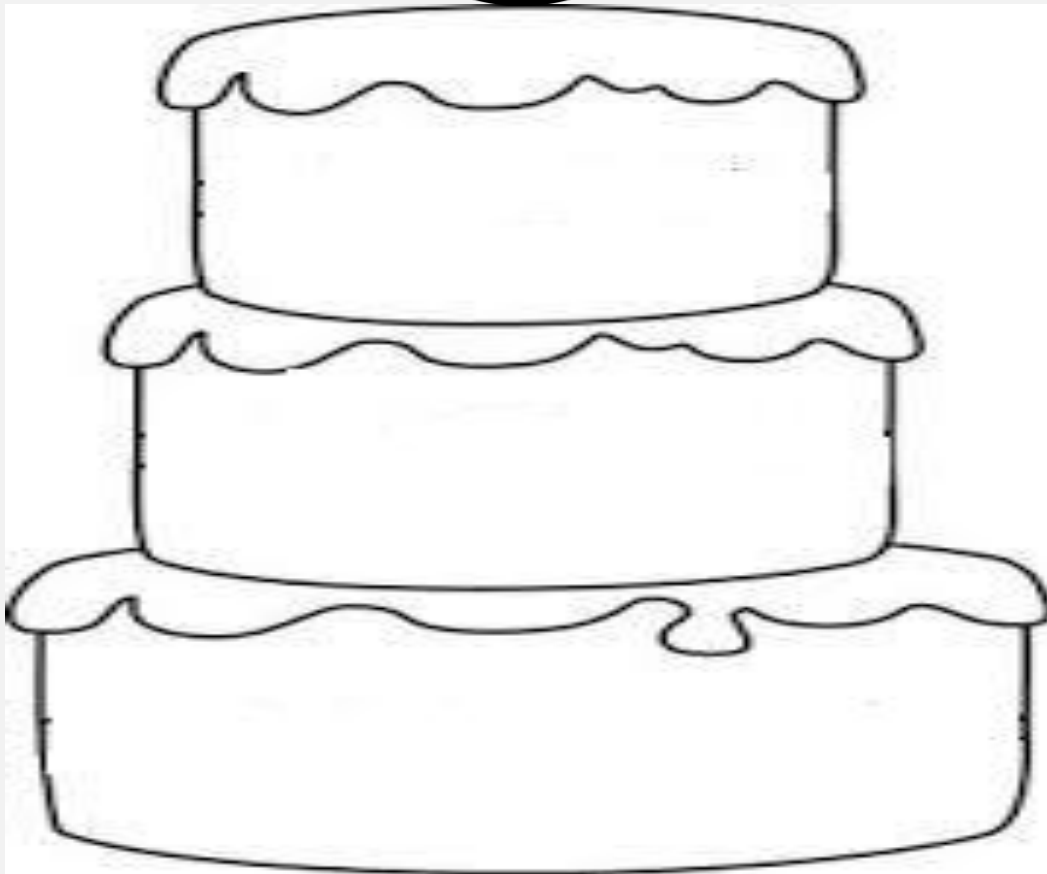
“... peace is more precious than diamonds or silver or gold.”
